BY THE COMMISSION:

On February 23, 2004, Qwest Corporation (Qwest) of Denver, Colorado, filed an application seeking approval of a Second Amendment to its Statement of Generally Available Terms (SGAT), pursuant to Section 252(f) of the 1996 Telecommunications Act. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on February 26, 2004. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's rule of modified procedure.

O P I N I O N     A N D     F I N D I N G S

On February 4, 2003, in Application No. C-2750, the Commission entered an order approving Qwest's Sixth Revised SGAT. Subsequently, on January 13, 2004, in Application No. C-3029, the Commission entered an order approving Qwest's First Amendment to its Sixth Revised SGAT.

In the current application, Qwest amends its revised SGAT, Exhibit B, in three ways:

First, it makes administrative changes only to increase the clarity, accuracy, and completeness of the Performance Indicator Definitions (PIDS), but there is no change to the meaning of any PID. Specifically, Qwest corrects typographical errors, updates outdated information and makes certain terms and phrases consistent throughout the PIDS.

Second, PO-16 is modified to correct an administrative oversight. The version previously filed omitted some of the intended red lined changes. Qwest has been reporting its monthly performance according to the correct version of the PO-16.

Third, GA-1 is changed to reflect the retirement of two interface components that were replaced by a single new interface.

All of these above-mentioned changes were discussed by the Long Term PID Administration (LTPA) on December 4th, 11th, and 18th of December, 2003. A number of staff from various state commissions attended those discussions.

The Commission is of the opinion and finds that Qwest's amended revised SGAT should be approved as set forth herein.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Qwest's amended revised SGAT, filed in Application No. C-3129, is hereby, approved.
