OPINION AND FINDINGS

On October 18, 2005, the Commission entered an order granting the application of N.E. Colorado Cellular, Inc. d/b/a Viaero Wireless, of Fort Morgan, Colorado seeking designation as eligible telecommunications carrier under 47 U.S.C. 214(e)(2). On page twelve of that order the Commission described the companies impacted by Viaero's application for redefinition of certain rural incumbent local exchange carrier (ILEC) service areas pursuant to Section 54.207(c) of the FCC's rules. Commission inadvertently included Arapahoe Telephone Company and Cambridge Telephone Company. According to the Amended Petition filed by Viaero on May 2, 2005, Viaero has the ability to serve the entire Arapahoe Telephone Company (Arapahoe) service area and the entire Cambridge Telephone Company (Cambridge) service area. Accordingly, Arapahoe and Cambridge should not be included in the areas Viaero requested to be redefined. The Commission enters this order nunc pro tunc to correct this error and to remove the reference to Arapahoe and Cambridge from that section of the order.

The purpose of an order nunc pro tunc is to correct the record which has been made so that it will truly record the action taken which, through inadvertence or mistake, was not truly recorded. <u>Interstate Printing Co. v. Dept. of Revenue</u>, 236 Neb. 110, 459 N.W.2d 519 (1990). Clerical errors may be corrected by an order nunc pro tunc, but not judicial errors. <u>Larson v. Bedke</u>, 211 Neb. 247, 318 N.W.2d 253 (1982).

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the order be corrected to remove the reference to Arapahoe Telephone Company and Cambridge Telephone Company from the redefinition section of the October 18, 2005 Order.
