BY THE COMMISSION:

On September 27, 2005, the Commission docketed a request by United Way of the Midlands for use of "211" as the dialing code for First Call for Help (FCFH) services in Cedar County. Notice of this docket was published in the <u>Daily Record</u>, Omaha, Nebraska on October 6, 2005.

The Commission previously assigned "211" to United Way of the Midlands in Application Nos. C-2621/PI-53, entered on February 20, 2002; C-2732, entered on July 23, 2002; C-3061/PI-75, entered on February 10, 2004; C-3066/PI-76, entered on February 10, 2004; C-3099/PI-77, entered on March 30, 2004; and C-3223/PI 81, entered on September 21, 2004; C-3277/PI-88, entered on February 1, 2005; C-3327/PI-90, entered on March 22, 2005; C-3344/PI-92, entered on March 29, 2005; C-3403/PI-95 entered on May 13, 2005; C-3446/PI-100, entered on July 19, 2005; and C-3454/PI-103 and C-3464/PI-105, entered on September 21, 2005 for use in numerous counties throughout the state.

No protests to the application were received. No letters of support were filed with the Commission in support of the United Way of the Midland's application. This application is being processed by modified procedure.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

The Commission finds that use of "211" by United Way of the Midlands should be expanded to Cedar County.

The contact person for United Way of the Midlands is Jamesena Grimes Moore, who can be reached at (402)522-7930. The routing numbers to be used for the "211" service are (402)444-6666 and (866)813-1731.

Consistent with the original applications, it is the Commission's preliminary belief that individual carrier costs for "211" access will not be significant. If, however, a carrier

seeks recovery of costs associated with routing "211" calls for expansion of "211" access to Cedar County, the Commission requires that plans for cost recovery be submitted to the Commission for approval.

The Commission will make available suggested language for directory listings and bill inserts. Affected telephone companies must use, at minimum, the information contained in these materials to inform their customers of the availability of "211" service. Affected telephone companies include those that serve Cedar County. The public must have easy directory access to 211 and other public interest numbers in order to maximize the benefit of such designations of scarce numbering resources. The Commission continues to strongly urge all carriers to require their directory publishing companies to display all public interest numbers such as 211, 511, 711 and 911 in a common and easily accessible location in the directory such as inside the front cover.

The Commission finds that **February 8, 2006**, should be the deadline for "211" routing for Cedar County.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that "211" is hereby, designated for use by United Way of the Midlands for a referral service in Cedar County.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that **February 8, 2006**, is the deadline set by the Commission for implementation of "211" routing for Dakota County.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that carriers seeking recovery of costs associated with routing "211" calls for Cedar County submit cost recovery plans to the Commission for approval.
