BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed January 4, 2006, Sprint Spectrum, L.P., (Sprint), Overland Park, Kansas, seeks approval of its interconnection agreement with ALLTEL Nebraska, (Alltel), Little Rock, Arkansas. Notice of the application was published in https://doi.org/10.1001/jhep-2006. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

Pursuant to Section 252(a) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the Act), Alltel and Sprint entered into an interconnection agreement arrived at through voluntary negotiation. An executed copy of this agreement is contained within the application.

Neither the agreement nor any portion thereof discriminates against any telecommunications carrier. Furthermore, the implementation of the agreement is consistent with the public interest, convenience and necessity.

Section 252(e) of the Act requires this Commission to review interconnection agreements adopted by negotiation or arbitration to ensure they comply with Sections 251 and 252(d) of the Act, as well as all applicable state laws. Using those standards, the interconnection agreement should be approved.
