## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On March 30, 2007, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) received an application from Total Call International, Inc., ("Total Call" or "Applicant") Los Angeles, California, seeking authority to operate as a resale carrier of interexchange telecommunication services within the State of Nebraska. Notice of the application was published in <a href="The Daily Record">The Daily Record</a>, Omaha, Nebraska, on April 5, 2007.

During routine processing of the application for financial Commission Accountant, Steve fitness, Stovall, discovered certain deficiencies with Total Call's application. As per Commission policy, on June 8, 2007, Mr. Stovall wrote a letter to Lance J.M. Steinhart, Esquire, the attorney for Total Call's further requesting financial information application, included contact information for the Commission. On June 28, 2007, the Commission was contacted by Ms. Charlotte Lacey, a legal assistant of Mr. Steinhart, requesting three weeks time to respond to the request for further information from Mr. Stovall.

On August 6, 2007, Mr. Stovall informed Commission attorney, Nichole Underhill, of the status of Total Call's application before the Commission. Ms. Underhill made telephone contact with Ms. Lacey requesting the required information concerning the application on two separate occasions on August 8, 2007.

The Commission received no response or communication of any kind from the Applicant or its attorney. On August 21, 2007, the Commission entered an order in the above-captioned docket giving the applicant until September 21, 2007, to submit the required information to the Commission or the Commission would dismiss the application for failure of the Applicant to take timely action.

As of the date of this order the Applicant has failed to submit the required documents to allow the Commission to process the Applicant's application for interexchange authority in Nebraska. Therefore, we find that the application in the above-captioned docket should be dismissed for failure by the Applicant to take timely action.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the Application in Docket C-3786 from Total Call International, Inc., be and is hereby dismissed.
