BY THE COMMISSION:

On February 19, 2008, an application was filed by Telava Acquisitions, Inc. ("TAI" or "Buyer"), San Francisco, California and IBFA Acquisition Company, LLC, ("IBFA" or "Company"), Elk Grove Village, Illinois, (together with TAI, the "Applicants") seeking approval of a transfer of ownership whereby TAI will acquire 100% of the interest of IBFA. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on March 3, 2008. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

The Parties:

IBFA is a Michigan limited liability company with principal offices located in Elk Grove Village, Illinois. IBFA provides resold interexchange telecommunications services in Nebraska under and by virtue of authority heretofore granted by this Commission.¹

TAI states that it is a corporation duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the laws of the State of Delaware, with its principal place of business located in San Francisco, California.

Description of the Transaction:

According to the application, the Applicants entered into an Agreement whereby TAI will acquire all of the membership interest of IBFA. Upon the purchase, TAI will have ownership and control of IBFA and all assets of the Company as they exist

on the closing date. The Applicants do not seek authority to transfer operating authority of IBFA. IBFA will continue to operate without interruption as a wholly-owned subsidiary of TAI. Each IBFA customer will continue to be served by IBFA pursuant to IBFA's current certification and operating authority.

The Applicants anticipate a seamless transition and the transaction will be transparent to IBFA's customers. The Applicants state that IBFA's name, rates and service offerings will not change as a result of the proposed transaction. There will be no interruption of service. The physical assets, property, and personnel of IBFA will remain the same after the transfer. Finally, TAI intends to retain all key IBFA personnel, including administrative and technical personnel, in roles similar to those prior to the transaction.

The Applicants state that the transaction is in the public interest because the proposed transaction will result in net benefits to IBFA customers by strengthening the ability of IBFA to compete as a telecommunications service provider and combine the telecommunications expertise of IBFA with the capital and other resources of TAI.

Based on the evidence, we find the application to be fair and reasonable and in the public interest. The application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-3914 be, and it is hereby, granted.
