BY THE COMMISSION:

On October 13, 2009, an application was filed by Gold Line Telemanagement Inc. (Applicant), Richmond Hill, Ontario, seeking to operate as an interexchange carrier telecommunications services within the State of Nebraska. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on October 15, 2009. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to Commission's rule of modified procedure.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Applicant is a privately held corporation, organized under the laws of Ontario, Canada. Applicant has been authorized by the Secretary of State to operate in Nebraska as a foreign corporation. In addition, no officer, director or shareholder having five percent or more of the applicant's voting securities has been involved in a formal complaint or other investigatory or enforcement proceeding.

Applicant has facilities in Canada, but is a switchless, non-facilities-based reseller of telecommunications services provided over the networks of underlying carriers in the United States. Applicant proposes to offer switched and dedicated interexchange telecommunications services primarily through prepaid long distance services. Applicant does not propose to provide alternative operator services nor require advanced payments or deposits.

Interexchange applications are subject to Commission jurisdiction under Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-129 and Title 291 of the Commission's Rules and Regulations, Chapter 5, Rule 003.12. From examination of the application filed herein, the Commission finds that Applicant has provided all the information required by the Commission, possesses adequate financial resources to provide the proposed service, and possesses adequate technical

competency to provide the proposed service. The application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-4218 be, and it is hereby, granted and Gold Line Telemanagement Inc., is authorized to operate as an interexchange carrier of telecommunications services within the State of Nebraska.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, to the extent applicable, the applicant shall comply with all laws pertaining to, and all rules and regulations promulgated under, the Telecommunications Relay System Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 86-301 to 86-315) and the Nebraska Telecommunications Universal Service Fund Act (Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 86-316 to 86-329).
