O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

Local exchange carriers operating in Nebraska that provide intrastate access services are required to file tariffs with the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission), setting forth the rates, terms and conditions under which intrastate access service is provided. The Commission on its own motion, opens this docket to investigate agreements and/or contracts between carriers operating in Nebraska, not filed with the Commission, to provide intrastate access services at rates, terms and conditions, other than those contained in a carrier's official tariff filed with the Commission.

During the hearing on Formal Complaints between Orbitcom, Inc. (Orbitcom) and AT&T Communications of the Midwest, Inc. (AT&T)¹, the Commission received testimony regarding an unfiled or "non-tariffed" agreement in which Orbitcom had been providing intrastate access services to AT&T at rates lower than those contained in Orbitcom's tariff on file with the Commission. During the course of the hearing the Commission received further evidence that other such agreements exist and are operational in Nebraska. These agreements are purportedly kept confidential from the Commission, as well as, other competing carriers in the market. The Commission took note of these unfiled agreements in the Docket FC-1332/FC-1335 Order stating,

The Commission has serious concerns regarding the existence of agreements between carriers that are not filed with the Commission




IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that a public investigation is hereby opened as captioned above.
