OPINION AND FINDINGS

On November 8, 2011, Common Point, LLC, ("Common Point") out of Springfield, Illinois, filed an application for authority to provide telecommunications services in Nebraska with the Nebraska Public Service Commission ("Commission"). Common Point also provided an intrastate access tariff that proposed to establish its initial access rates in Nebraska. Pursuant to Commission established procedures, the proposed access tariff was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on November 14, 2011. Any affected interexchange carrier desiring to negotiate the rates as proposed by Common Point, pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-140, had thirty (30) days to request such negotiations in writing.

On December 14, 2011, AT&T Communications of the Midwest, Inc., and TCG Omaha (collectively, "AT&T"), filed with the Commission a copy of the written notice it sent to Common Point requesting negotiations. Pursuant to Commission procedures adopted in Docket C-4145, the parties had 60 days from the date of publication to negotiate and file a negotiation report with the Commission.²

On January 18, 2012, Common Point and AT&T filed a letter requesting an extension of time to negotiate. On January 23, 2012, I entered an order granting an extension of the filing deadline to allow the parties to continue negotiations.

On May 3, 2012, Common Point and AT&T filed a letter requesting further extension of time to negotiate. The parties continue to negotiate and request until June 15, 2012, to report the outcome of negotiations in the above-captioned docket.
