# BY THE COMMISSION:

On May 31, 2012, an application was filed by Qwest Corporation d/b/a CenturyLink QC, (CenturyLink) of Denver, Colorado, seeking approval of an ICC Bill and Keep Amendment to the Interconnection Agreement with New Cingular Wireless PCS, LLC, and its Commercial Mobile Radio Service operating affiliates, d/b/a AT&T Mobility (AT&T), Atlanta, Georgia, (collectively, the "Parties"). Notice of the application was published in <a href="The Daily Record">The Daily Record</a>, Omaha, Nebraska, on June 5, 2012. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

### OPINION AND FINDINGS

Pursuant to Section 252(a) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996 (the Act), the Parties entered into an Interconnection Agreement (Agreement) for service in the State of Nebraska that was approved by the Nebraska Public Service Commission on September 14, 1999.

On May 8, 2012, the Parties agreed to an ICC Bill and Keep Amendment (Amendment) to the Interconnection Agreement. The Amendment is intended to amend the Agreement by adding the terms, conditions, and rates contained therein. This Amendment, upon approval by the Commission, will become a part of the Agreement.

The Commission finds this Amendment does not discriminate against any telecommunications carrier. Furthermore, the
