#### BY THE COMMISSION:

On May 20, 2014, an application was filed by Neutral Path Communications, LLC, ("Applicant"), Mankato, Minnesota, seeking authority to operate and provide interlata and intralata private line transport services within the State of Nebraska. Notice of the application was published in <a href="The Daily Record">The Daily Record</a>, Omaha, Nebraska, on May 23, 2014. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's rule of modified procedure.

## OPINION AND FINDINGS

Applicant is a limited liability company organized under the laws of the State of Minnesota. Applicant has been authorized by the Secretary of State to operate in Nebraska as a foreign corporation. In addition, no officer, director or shareholder having five percent or more of the Applicant's voting securities has been involved in a formal complaint or other investigatory or enforcement proceeding.

Applicant provides point-to-point private line transport services and colocation in Minnesota and Iowa. Applicant seeks to provide point-to-point dark fiber and/or fiber transport private line services to end user customers in the State of Applicant initially intends to offer service in the Nebraska. Omaha metropolitan area. The services will be provided via Applicant-owned and operated dark fiber optic facilities and Applicant further may purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire additional facilities from third parties to meet customer's Applicant proposes to directly connect transport facilities to customer premises but does not plan to use Incumbent Local Exchange Carrier local loops or broadband connection to provide its services. Applicant plans to offer services on a retail and wholesale basis. Applicant states its services are primarily for data network service providers and/or large business customers.

From examination of the application filed herein, the Commission finds that Applicant has provided all the information required by the Commission, possesses adequate financial resources to provide the proposed service, and possesses adequate technical competency to provide the proposed service. The application should be granted.
