BY THE COMMISSION:

On October 2, 2014, an application was filed by Missouri Network Alliance, LLC d/b/a Bluebird Network, LLC ("MNA" or "Applicant") of Columbia, Missouri, seeking authority to provide resold and facilities-based local exchange telecommunications services in the State of Nebraska. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on October 6, 2014. No protests were filed; therefore, this application is processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

OPINION AND FINDINGS

Applicant is a Missouri corporation, with its headquarters in Columbia, Missouri. Applicant has been authorized by the Secretary of State to operate in Nebraska as a foreign corporation. In addition, no officer, director or shareholder having five percent or more of the Applicant's voting securities has been involved in a formal complaint or other investigatory or enforcement proceeding within the last two years.

Applicant is currently authorized to provide local exchange services in Kansas and Iowa and is authorized as an access tandem provider in Missouri.

Applicant proposes to offer competitive local services through the State of Nebraska using its own facilities and facilities leased from other carriers. The services will be provided on a wholesale basis to other service providers and on a resale basis to residential and business end user customers. MNA proposes to provide exchange access services, dedicated and switched access services, private line services, enhanced services, and a variety of transport services. The Applicant further states it will provide voice and data service solutions to municipalities, CLECs, ILECs, and CATV providers. Services will be provided on a retail, wholesale, carrier including PSTN connectivity and intermediate carrier functions.

Applicant will offer operator services through its contracts with third parties and comply with all requirements regarding the provision of 911 and Telephone Relay Service.

MNA maintains its own toll-free customer service number and customer service is available seven days a week, twenty-four hours a day for billing and customer service related issues and inquiries.

Further, the Applicant shall and has agreed to comply with all state and federal rules and regulations governing the provisions of dial tone or voice grade service.

Exhibit F to the application contains MNA's most recent financial statements. The Applicant does not propose to require advanced payments or deposits.

Applicant states it possesses the necessary technical expertise and management team to serve Nebraska customers. In Exhibit G to the application, Applicant provided profiles of its key executive and technical management.

Applicant states a grant of this application will serve the public interest because Applicant's proposed services will benefit the public by increasing the level of competition in the Nebraska telecommunications and broadband market. Increased competition will in turn promote other providers to operate more efficiently and pass the resultant cost savings on to consumers. Further, the Applicant states increased competition will improve the overall quality and variety of telecommunications and broadband services within the state.

The Commission considers this application for authority in light of the following criteria and standards established in the Commission's telecommunications rules:

- (a) Whether the Applicant has provided the information required by the Commission;
- (b) Whether the Applicant has provided a performance bond, if required;
- (c) Whether the Applicant possesses adequate financial resources to provide the proposed service;
- (d) Whether the Applicant possesses adequate technical competence and resources to provide the proposed service;

- (e) Whether the Applicant possesses adequate managerial competence to provide the proposed service; and
- (f) Whether granting the Applicant a certificate preserves and advances universal service, protects the public safety and welfare, ensures the continued quality of telecommunications services and safeguards the rights of consumers, pursuant to Section 253(b) of the Act.

Applicant has demonstrated that it meets the standards of financial, technical and managerial competence and all other criteria necessary to provide local exchange services in the State of Nebraska.

These opinions and findings carry no precedential value other than establishing minimum standards and criteria to apply when considering applications to provide local exchange services. All telecommunications carriers seeking such a certificate must demonstrate that they meet, at a minimum, the standards and criteria set forth herein.

Before the Applicant is allowed to provide local exchange service to its users, it must either:

- Through negotiation or arbitration, reach an interconnection/resale agreement with the pertinent incumbent local exchange carrier and receive Commission approval of the interconnection/resale agreement; or
- 2. In the event a certified local exchange carrier provides a wholesale tariff, purchase rates from that tariff, file its own tariff and receive Commission approval of its tariff.

This order does not terminate, waive or in any manner diminish the exemptions and protections created by the Act for rural carriers, as defined by the Act. This order does not address the issue of the rural local exchange carrier exemption under the Act. Rural exemptions may be terminated, suspended or modified only as provided in Section 251(f) of the Act.

Prior to providing service in any area in the State of Nebraska, Applicant must file tariffs in accordance with the provisions of Section 002.21 of the Neb. Admin. R. & Regs. Title 291, ch. 5.

Upon the offering of local exchange services in the State of Nebraska, Applicant would be subject to the same laws, rules

and regulations, both federal and state (including any laws, rules or regulations regarding universal service, restrictions on joint marketing and quality of service), applicable to any other local exchange company except those obligations imposed on ILECs pursuant to Section 251(c) of the Act.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. C-4720 be, and hereby is, granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant is obligated to abide by the same laws, rules and regulations, both federal and state (including any laws, rules or regulations regarding universal service, restrictions on joint marketing and quality of service), applicable to any other local exchange carriers, except obligations imposed on incumbent local exchange carriers pursuant to Section 251(c) of the Act.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that, to the extent Applicant provides access line service as referenced in the Telecommunications Relay System Act, Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 86-301 through 86-315(Relay Act) and defined in Neb. Admin. R. & Reg. Title 291, ch. 5 § 001.01B, the Applicant shall collect from its subscribers a surcharge (Relay Surcharge) pursuant to the relay act and the Commission's annual orders establishing the amount of the surcharge, and shall remit to the Commission the proceeds from the relay surcharge as provided by the Relay Act.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Applicant comply with all necessary statutes and Commission Rules and Regulations as they pertain to the Nebraska Universal Service Fund.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant shall file, in accordance with the applicable statutes, on or before April 30 of each year, an annual report with the Commission consisting of: (a) a copy of any report filed with the Federal Communications Commission; (b) a copy of any annual report to stockholders; and (c) a copy of the latest Form 10-K filed with the Securities and Exchange Commission. If such reports are unavailable, Applicant shall file a balance sheet and income statement for the previous year of operation, and for the State of Nebraska on a combined interstate-intrastate basis, the investment in the telephone plant and equipment located within the state, accumulated depreciation thereon, operating revenues, operating expenses and taxes.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that within 30 days from the entry of this order that the Applicant file a tariff and pay appropriate

filing fees with the Commission as required by state statutes and the Commission's regulations.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that this order be, and hereby is, made the Commission's official Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to the Applicant to provide facilities-based and resold local exchange telecommunications services in the State of Nebraska.
