## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On or about March 23, 2017, Stanton Telecom Inc. of Stanton, Nebraska, ("Stanton" or "Applicant") filed an application to increase its basic local exchange rates for residential service from \$17.50 to \$19.95 and from \$27.50 to \$29.95 for business service. Notice was provided as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-141(2) and Neb Admin Code tit. 291 ch. 5 § 002.33 to all subscribers who would be affected by the proposed rate adjustment. Such notice was provided on March 22, 2017.

On May 23, 2017, the Director of the Communications Department and Stanton entered into a joint stipulation. The parties stipulated the proposed rate increase is fair, just and reasonable as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. §86-147. The parties noted the rates are consistent with or near the approved benchmark range of \$17.95 to \$19.95 established in NUSF-50.¹ The parties also noted that Stanton has not increased its basic local exchange rates since 2001. The stipulating parties agreed a hearing was not necessary unless enough petitions were received to require a hearing.

Based on the foregoing information, the Commission finds that the stipulation should be approved. The Commission further finds the proposed rate should become effective July 1, 2017, absent the requisite number of petitions required to trigger a Commission hearing.

## ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the stipulated agreement between Stanton Telecom Inc. and the Communications Department shall be and it is hereby approved.
