OPINION AND FINDINGS

On or about April 6, 2017, Northeast Nebraska Telephone Company, Jackson, Nebraska, ("NNTC" or "Applicant") filed an application to increase its basic local exchange rates from \$17.50 to \$20.00. Notice of the application appeared in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on April 10, 2017. Notice was provided as required by Section 86-141(2) and Neb Admin Code tit. 291 ch. 5 \$002.33 to all subscribers who would be affected by the proposed rate adjustment. Such notice was provided on March 30, 2017.

On June 19, 2017, the Director of the Communications Department and NNTC entered into a joint stipulation. The parties stipulated that the proposed rate increase is fair, just, and reasonable as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. § 86-147. The parties noted the rates are consistent with or near the approved benchmark range of \$17.95 to \$19.95 established in NUSF-50.1 The parties also noted that NNTC has not increased its basic local exchange rates since 2001. The stipulating parties agreed a hearing was not necessary unless enough petitions were received to require a hearing.

Based on the foregoing information, the Commission finds that the stipulation should be approved. The Commission further finds the proposed rate should become effective July 1, 2017, absent the requisite number of petitions required to trigger a Commission hearing.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the stipulated agreement between Northeast Nebraska Telephone Company and the Communications Department shall be and it is hereby approved.
