OPINION AND FINDINGS

On or about April 21, 2017, Cambridge Telephone Company, Cambridge, Nebraska, ("Cambridge" or "Applicant") filed an application to increase its basic local exchange rates from \$17.50 to \$19.95. Notice was provided as required by Section 86-141(2) and Neb Admin Code Tit. 291 Ch. $5 \$ 002.33 to all subscribers who would be affected by the proposed rate adjustment. Such notice was provided on April 17, 2017.

On July 11, 2017, the Director of the Communications Department and Cambridge entered into a joint stipulation. The parties stipulated the proposed rate increase is fair, just, and reasonable as required by Neb. Rev. Stat. §86-147. The parties noted the rates are consistent with or near the approved benchmark range of \$17.95 to \$19.95 established in NUSF-50.¹ The parties also noted that Cambridge has not increased its basic local exchange rate since 1999. The stipulating parties agreed a hearing was not necessary unless enough petitions were received to require a hearing.

Based on the foregoing information, the Commission finds that the stipulation should be approved. The Commission further finds the proposed rate should become effective August 1, 2017, absent the requisite number of petitions required to trigger a Commission hearing.
