## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On September 7, 2010, the Commission entered an order setting a procedural schedule for the application filed by Long Lines Wireless, LLC in the above-captioned matter. Dept. of Revenue</u>, 236 Neb. 110, 459 N.W. 519 (1990). Clerical errors may be corrected by an order nunc pro tunc, but not judicial errors. <u>Larson v. Bedke</u>, 211 Neb. 247, 318 N.W.2d 253 (1982).
