OPINION AND FINDINGS

By Application filed September 11, 2018, Windstream Nebraska Inc., ("Windstream") seeks high-cost support from the Nebraska Universal Service Fund (NUSF). Notice of the application appeared in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, and in the Hastings, Nebraska, on September 17, 2018.

Windstream sought support in the amount of One hundred eighteen thousand two hundred and twenty-six dollars (\$118,226) for the construction of facilities in the northern area of Harvard, Nebraska. Windstream stated that the central office for Harvard is currently connected with interoffice fiber facilities. Subscribers within the reach of the office can receive 4Mbps down/1Mbps upload broadband or better depending on the copper loop length from the equipment. The proposed project would address subscribers in the northern area of the exchange that have exceptionally long loop lengths and therefore cannot receive broadband. The solution proposed by Windstream is a fixed wireless solution.

According to the Application, network upgrades will enable a network capable of a minimum of 10 Mbps download and 1 mbps upload. According to Windstream, the majority of customers will have speeds of 25Mbps and up to 100Mbps available.

Windstream projects the total deployment cost for the project is \$133,261. Windstream is requesting partial support in the amount of \$118,226 to account for the removal of blocks that have an unsubsidized competitor or

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where funding is provided by the FCC's Connect America Fund Phase 2 program.

Windstream estimates the project will be completed within 180 days of application approval. If the project is approved, Windstream will commit to providing broadband service to all households in the project area for a minimum of five years.

The Commission staff conducted an analysis of the census blocks submitted and compared the information against the Connect America Fund Phase II eligible areas. The Commission staff also reviewed the census block information and compared it to its wireline Broadband Mapping data, which uses FCC Form 477 deployment data collected by the FCC biannually. The Commission finds support should be granted in the amount of \$118,226 as requested by Windstream.

Requests for Reimbursement:

Windstream must first make the investment and then may file a request for reimbursement with the NUSF Department. Windstream does not need to complete the construction process prior to seeking reimbursement; rather, it may work with the NUSF Department to develop intervals at which reimbursement can be sought. The NUSF Department will reimburse Windstream for capital improvement costs made relative to and as included in the application filed by the company for the projects approved in this Order. Once the investment is made, Windstream shall file a request for support, provide the NUSF Department with documentation consistent with Department policy and shall certify to the Department that it had made the described investment for the provision, maintenance and upgrading of facilities and services in the described rural areas.

Reporting Requirements:

Windstream shall file, on an annual basis, consistent federally designated eligible telecommunications (ETCs), carriers the information required Commission's Telecommunications Rules pertaining to ETCs and the investment information required by the Commission's Order in Docket NUSF-66. The report should make clear to Commission that Windstream will not reimbursement for equipment where grant money was also Application No. NUSF-99.10

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received from another source. Windstream shall file its annual report on or before June 1 of each year.

In addition, the Applicant shall be required to complete the approved projects within two (2) years from the date of this Order unless good cause is shown for a later completion date.

Broadband Commitments:

The Commission maintains broadband availability data and updates that information on at least an annual basis. As a condition of this support, Windstream must report broadband availability to the Commission upon request. Windstream must also confirm that it will not seek duplicative support through the Federal Communication Commission's (FCC's) funding mechanisms.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the above-captioned application submitted by Windstream be and it is hereby granted as described herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Windstream shall be subject to all terms and conditions adopted in this Order.
