## OPINIONS AND FINDINGS

By application filed October 1, 2019, Extreme Nightlife, LLC ("Applicant"), Lincoln, seeks authority to operate as a common carrier of passengers by motor vehicle as follows:

# AUTHORITY SOUGHT

Common: Transportation of passengers by bus in special party and charter service between all points in Nebraska over irregular routes. RESTRICTIONS: The transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized. HHS Designation: No.

Notice of the application was published in <a href="The Daily Record">The Daily Record</a>, Omaha, Nebraska, on October 22, 2019. Because no protests were filed, Application No. B-2005 was processed pursuant to Rule 002.10B of the Commission Rules of Procedure. Due to a clerical error, notice of the application was republished in <a href="The Daily Record">The Daily Record</a> on January 29, 2020. No protests were received.

After due consideration of the evidence and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

 Applicant is fit, willing, and able properly to perform the proposed service, and to conform to the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-301 to 75-322 (2018) and the requirements, rules and regulations of the Commission APPLICATION NO. B-2005

thereunder.

2. Upon compliance with NEB. REV. STAT. §§ 75-305 (fees), 75-307 (insurance), and 75-308 (rates)(2018), and with the rules and regulations of the Commission, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity should be issued as proposed:

## CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZED

SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

Common: Transportation of passengers by bus in special party and charter service between all points in Nebraska over irregular routes. RESTRICTIONS: The transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized. HHS Designation: No.

3. The application for authority should be granted.

#### ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. B-2005 be, and it is hereby, granted; and that upon compliance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity shall be issued to Extreme Nightlife LLC, Lincoln, Nebraska, in Application No. B-2005, authorizing the operations set forth in the foregoing findings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant shall not be issued the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity authorized by the Commission unless and until Applicant has fully complied, within a reasonable time from the effective date of this Order, with NEB. REV. STAT. §§ 75-305 (fees), 75-307 (insurance), and 75-308 (rates)(2018), and with the rules and regulations of the Commission, and if upon expiration of such time Applicant has not complied with such terms and conditions, this Order shall, after reasonable notice to Applicant, be of no further force and effect.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant shall not conduct operations until a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is issued.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the operations authorized herein shall be subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations which
