#### BY THE COMMISSION:

On August 10, 2020, No-Prob-Limo, LLC ("Applicant"), Lincoln, filed an application seeking authority as a common carrier in Nebraska intrastate commerce in the transportation of passengers by stretch limousine and van in limousine service between points in Lancaster, Douglas, Seward, Gage, Washington, Otoe and Saline counties, and between said counties, over irregular routes. The transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized, and HHS Designation is no.

Notice of the Application was published in <u>The Daily Record</u>, Omaha, Nebraska, on August 13, 2020. Timely protest was filed by VIP Limousine, LLC ("Protestant"), Omaha, which was granted on September 18, 2020.

On September 18, 2020, the Hearing Officer granted Applicant's request to amend its application due to its discussions with Protestant. The amended application restricts the proposed services in Douglas County to only transport passengers from Lincoln to Omaha Eppley Airfield and from Omaha Eppley Airfield to Lincoln. Applicant's request would not authorize any other services to be provided in Douglas County, and all other proposed counties would remain unchanged. On October 15, 2020, Protestant requested to withdraw its protest. Application B-2017 was then processed pursuant to the Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

#### OPINION AND FINDINGS

No-Prob-Limo, LLC is a Nebraska Limited Liability Company with its principal business office in Lincoln, Nebraska. Applicant seeks to provide limousine services as a common carrier in the proposed amended territories. Applicant will begin offering services with one vehicle.

After due consideration of the evidence and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

- 1. Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the service proposed and to conform to the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-301 to 75-322 and the requirements, rules and regulations of the Commission therender.
- 2. The proposed intrastate service is or will be required by the present or future public convenience and necessity to the following extent:

## CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZED

### SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

COMMON: the transportation of passengers by stretch limousine and van in limousine service between points in Lancaster, Douglas, Seward, Gage, Washington, Otoe and Saline counties, and between said counties, over irregular routes. RESTRICTIONS: Transportation of passengers in Douglas County is restricted to trips originating from Lancaster County to Omaha Eppley Airfield and from Omaha Eppley Airfield to Lancaster County only. The transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized. HHS Designation: No.

3. The application should be approved.

### ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. B-2017 be, and it is hereby, granted as amended; and that upon compliance with the terms and conditions set forth in the Order, a Certificate of Public

Convenience and Necessity shall be issued to No-Prob-Limo, LLC, Lincoln, Nebraska in Application No. B-2017, authorizing the operations set forth in the foregoing findings.

IT IS FURTHERED ORDERED that Applicant shall not be issued the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity authorized by the Commission unless and until Applicant has fully complied, within a reasonable time from the effective date of this Order, with Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-305 (fees), 75-307 (insurance), and 75-308 (rates), and with the rules and regulations of the Commission, and if upon expiration of such terms and conditions, this Order shall, after reasonable notice to Applicant, be of no further force and effect.

IT IS FINALLY ORDERED that Applicant shall not conduct operations until a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is issued.
