BY THE COMMISSION:

By application filed August 3, 2020, Sebastian Moving Omaha, LLC, ("Applicant"), Omaha, seeks authority to operate as a common carrier of household goods by motor vehicle as follows:

AUTHORITY SOUGHT

Transportation of household goods by straight truck between points in Douglas, Washington, and Sarpy counties, and between said counties on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points in Nebraska over irregular routes.

Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on September 3, 2020. Because no protests were filed, Application M-14255 was processed pursuant to Commission's Rule of Modified Procedure.

O P I N I O N A N D F I N D I N G S

Applicant is a Nebraska Limited Liability Company with its principal place of business in Omaha, Nebraska. Applicant seeks to provide household goods moving services as a common carrier in the proposed territory noted above. Applicant proposes to begin providing services with one truck through an equipment lease to the company. Applicant will file the required equipment lease paperwork with the Transportation Department to ensure proper registration of the vehicle to be used in its services.

After due consideration of the evidence and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

1. Applicant is fit, willing, and able to properly perform the proposed service, and to conform to the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-301 to 75-322 (Cum. Supp. 2020) and the requirements, rules and regulations of the Commission thereunder.
2. Upon compliance with Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-305 (fees), 75-307 (insurance), and 75-308 (rates) (Cum. Supp. 2020), and with the rules and regulations of the Commission, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity should be issued as proposed:

CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZED

SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

COMMON: Transportation of household goods by straight truck between points in Douglas, Washington, and Sarpy counties, and between said counties on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points in Nebraska over irregular routes.

3. The application for authority should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application M-14255 be, and it is hereby, granted; and that upon compliance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity shall be issued to Sebastian Moving Omaha, LLC, Omaha, Nebraska, in Application M-14255, authorizing the operations set forth in the foregoing findings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant shall not be issued the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity authorized by the Commission unless and until Applicant has fully complied, within a reasonable time from the effective date of this Order, with Neb. Rev. Stat. §§ 75-305 (fees), 75-307 (insurance), and 75-308 (rates) (Cum. Supp. 2020), and with the rules and regulations of the Commission, and if upon expiration of such time Applicant has not complied with such terms and conditions, this Order shall, after reasonable notice to Applicant, be of no further force and effect.
