## OPINION AND FINDINGS

On October 6, 2020, the Nebraska Public Service Commission ("Commission"), on its own motion, opened the above-captioned docket to investigate actions that may be required in response to the passage of LB 461, passed by the Nebraska Legislature and signed by the Governor during the 2020 Legislative session.

LB 461 amended several statutes, including the removal of motor carriers that solely provide transportation of household goods from the definition of regulated motor carrier and contract carrier. Effective July 1, 2021, those motor carriers are to be issued licenses before providing any transportation services in intrastate commerce. On December 15, 2020, the Commission entered an Order in this docket to provide a method of transferring the authorities held by railroad employee transportation carriers from certificates or permits of authority to a license.¹ The Commission must now consider what process will be most appropriate for certificated and permitted household goods movers.

Review of Commission records show that 58 carriers currently hold authority to provide transportation of household goods, and four carriers have pending applications. Pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 75-118.01, a hearing should be held to receive evidence and testimony from affected carriers and interested persons regarding the following:

1. Whether these carriers' authority should be retained by transferring such authority from each carrier's certificate or permit of authority and reissuing said authority to a license with such terms as specified by LB 461; or

2. Whether these carriers' authority should be considered null and void as of July 1, 2021 and such carriers should be required to file an application for a license to provide intrastate transportation services prior to the July 1, 2021 effective date.
