OPINION AND FINDINGS

The Nebraska Public Service Commission ("Commission"), on its own motion, hereby opens the above-captioned docket to investigate the use of certain differential rates and charges by motor carriers providing for-hire intrastate passenger transportation in the state of Nebraska.

Nebraska statute § 75-126 states that a common carrier shall not charge, demand, collect or receive more or less compensation from any person than what rates are filed with and prescribed by the Commission, with few exceptions. A common carrier may perform services at free or reduced rates for the following persons or entities: The United States, the State of Nebraska, or any governmental subdivision thereof; employees, both present and retired, of such common carrier; any person when the object is to provide disaster relief; any person who transports property for charitable purposes; ministers and others giving their entire time to religious or charitable work; or any person who is legally blind or visually impaired. 1 Differential rates are those rates charged and collected by a common carrier from a person either in a lesser or increased amount from the rate that the common carrier charges and collects from any other person for the same or contemporaneous service and does not fall under one of the listed exemptions

On January 1, 2011, the Commission entered an order eliminating differential rates from the published rates of certain certificated transportation carriers to the extent that such rates were in violation of Neb. Rev. Stat. § 75-126 and other applicable statutes. The carriers in question were charging and collecting differing rates for general public

transportation of ambulatory persons and persons utilizing wheelchairs. The Order also stated that § 75-126 allows a common carrier to charge a governmental entity at a free or reduced rate. The Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services ("NDHHS") had contracted with common carriers to provide transportation services and paid differential rates depending upon whether the transportation was provided using a vehicle that complied with the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act. As NDHHS transportation was not found to be general public transportation, such rates fell under the exception of § 75-126(2)(a) for governmental subdivisions allowing services to be provided a free or reduced rates.

Much has changed for NDHHS transportation since the Commission's 2011 Order. On July 1, 2019, changes to the NDHHS brokerage system for non-emergency medical transportation ("NEMT") included changes to the reimbursement process for certificated motor carriers authorized to provide NEMT transportation through their HHS Designation. In 2011, reimbursement for NEMT services came from NDHHS through the broker to the motor carrier. In 2019, the reimbursements instead began to be paid by Managed Care Organizations ("MCO") to the motor carrier through the broker. Because MCOs are not governmental subdivisions, it was determined that NEMT services must be paid according to the HHS Designated motor carrier's rates filed with and approved by the Commission.

The Transportation Department recently conducted a review of certificated passenger carrier rates. The review showed that several passenger carriers still charge differential rates, including differential rates for ambulatory and wheelchair transportation services where the rate is higher for wheelchair transportation services than ambulatory transportation services. Additional differential rates include senior citizen and military/veteran discounts. The differential rates must be addressed to determine compliance with § 75-126.

Based on the above, the Commission finds that this docket should be opened, and a proceeding scheduled to discuss these differential rates, with special emphasis on rates charged and

collected for ambulatory and wheelchair transportation services.
