BY THE COMMISSION:

On January 28, 2003, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission), on its own motion, initiated this investigation to examine the development of a uniform range in household goods mover rates and to develop procedures to efficiently process household goods mover tariff amendments. The Commission established an annual review process to determine any adjustments in the household goods movers Tariffs 7F and 22, which included mailing affidavits to all certificated household goods movers. On December 19, 2017, the Commission entered an Order postponing the annual affidavit process and opened two dockets to update the tariff rates and charges.¹

On August 11, 2020, the Governor signed LB 461, which made several changes to the Commission's regulation of household goods movers. Specifically, LB 461 removed the Commission's authority to fix rates and charges for intrastate household goods moving services and reproduce tariffs containing the rates and charges for transporting household goods as of July 1, 2021.² As a result, licensed household goods movers may now establish all rates and charges for their services and file those rates with the Commission periodically. The Official Household Goods Tariff 7F and Official Intracity Household Goods Tariff 22 are

Any movers that choose to adopt either tariff for their operations must eventually file their own tariff document if any changes are made to the rates and charges within the tariffs as each document exists today.

Based on the above, the Commission finds that this investigation should be closed.




O R D E R
