OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed with the Commission on June 2, 1992, Terry E. Jones dba T.J.'s Limousine Service, Brownville, Nebraska, hereinafter referred to as applicant, was issued a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in Application B-1301. An order was entered, at applicant's request, on September 25, 2001, suspending applicant's certificate until October 1, 2002. Applicant was informed that its authority is no longer in suspension and that it must make full compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations.

As of October 1, 2002, applicant is still not in full compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations; to wit: No Form E insurance filing has been made and no annual fees have been paid.

After due consideration of the circumstances, the Commission finds that applicant should be ordered to show cause on or before November 1, 2002, why its certificate should not be revoked for its failure to comply with the Motor Carrier Rules of the Commission.



O R D E R
