BY THE COMMISSION:

OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed May 4, 1994, Dashabout Roadrunner, Inc., Akron, Colorado, hereinafter referred to as applicant, seeks approval of the acquisition of the operating rights and authority granted to Valera Lea Holtorf, dba Dashabout Roadrunner in Certificate B-1350 which authorizes:

SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

(A) Passengers and their baggage by vans between points in Dundy, Hitchcock, Red Willow, Chase, Hayes, Frontier, Perkins, Lincoln, Dawson, Keith, Deuel, Garden, Morrill, and Cheyenne counties over irregular routes. Restriction: Transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized.

(B) Passengers and their baggage by vans between points in Furnas, Gosper, Harlan, Phelps, Buffalo, Kearney, Adams, Hall, Hamilton, York, Seward, Cass, Sarpy, Douglas, Lancaster, Hooker, McPherson, Thomas, and Logan counties over irregular routes. Restrictions: (1) Transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized; and (2) Point-to-point service within the City of Lincoln is not authorized, except for transportation of friends or relatives of passengers already aboard which have originated or will terminate in communities outside of Lincoln from the Lincoln Municipal Airport to medical facilities, the University of Nebraska, the Amtrak Station, and/or the Cornhusker Hotel.

In its application, applicant further requested that this Commission grant temporary approval to the applicant of a lease of the motor carrier properties and the certificate sought to be acquired by it. Notice of such request for temporary authority was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on May 5, 1994, pursuant to the rules and regulations of this Commission.

It appears that failure to grant temporary approval may result in destruction of or injury to such motor carrier property and the certificate sought to be acquired, or interfere substantially with their future usefulness in the performance of adequate and continuous service to the public.

Such temporary approval should be granted for ninety (90) days from the effective date of this Order pursuant to 75-319, R.R.S. 1943, as amended.

O R D E R

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the application for approval of a lease of the motor carrier properties and the certificate sought to be acquired by Dashabout Roadrunner, Inc. be, and it is hereby, granted to the applicant for ninety (90) days from the effective date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that transportation service rendered under such temporary authority shall be subject to the provisions of 75-101 to 75-801, R.R.S. 1943, as amended, and to the rules, regulations and requirements of the Commission; such grant of temporary authority and the operations thereunder shall not be admissible in evidence to establish or prove present or future public convenience and necessity; and no renewal or extension of the period of ninety (90) days shall be granted.
