OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed with the Commission on May 13, 1996, Rodney D. Oberle dba Park Avenue Limousines, Vermillion, South Dakota, hereinafter referred to as applicant, was issued a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in Application B-1415. An order was entered, at applicant's request, on March 5, 2002, suspending applicant's certificate until February 26, 2003. Applicant was informed by certified mail that its authority is no longer in suspension and that it must make full compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations.

As of March 4, 2003, applicant is still not in full compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations; to wit: No Form E insurance filing has been made and no annual fees have been paid.

After due consideration of the circumstances, the Commission finds that applicant should be ordered to show cause on or before April 8, 2003, why its certificate should not be revoked for its failure to comply with the Motor Carrier Rules of the Commission.

O R D E R

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Rodney D. Oberle dba Park Avenue Limousines, Vermillion, South Dakota, be, and it is hereby ordered to show cause why its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity should not be revoked for failure to comply with Commission rules on or before April 9, 2003, and a hearing was set for April 9, 2003, at 9:30 a.m. in the Commission Hearing Room, Lincoln.
