OPINION AND FINDINGS

It was brought to the Commission's attention that an order nunc pro tunc should be entered to correctly reflect the authority granted by the Commission in the application of Raymond L. Eichman. The Commission has reviewed the files and records of the Commission and finds that a portion of the authority granted in the order of February 9, 1999, is at variance with that agreed upon by the parties involved in that the restrictions of authority listed failed to include a restriction regarding the transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage.

From the evidence adduced in these proceedings and being fully informed in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that:

1. The order entered herein on February 9, 1999, should be corrected nunc pro tunc.
2. The authority should read as follows:

SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

Transportation of passengers between points within a 100-mile radius of York over irregular routes under continuing contracts with FHC Options, Inc. RESTRICTIONS: Restricted to transportation originating in York County. The transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized.


O R D E R

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission, that its order entered herein February 9, 1999, be, and it is hereby, amended nunc pro tunc and that a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity be issued to Raymond L. Eichman setting forth the authority in the foregoing findings. All of the other findings, conditions and orders set forth in the previous order shall remain in full force and effect.


