BY THE COMMISSION:

The purpose of an order nunc pro tunc is to correct the record which has been made so that it will truly record the action taken which, through inadvertence or mistake, was not truly recorded. Interstate Printing Co. v. Dept. of Revenue, 236 Neb. 110, 459 N.W.2d 519 (1990). Clerical errors may be corrected by an order nunc pro tunc, but not judicial errors. Larson v. Bedke, 211 Neb. 247, 318 N.W.2d 253 (1982).

Upon review of the Commission's order entered January 19, 2005, in Application No. B-1550, Supplement 3, it has come to our attention that a typographical error was made. The name of the authority granted to Abbott Transportation, Inc., in Certificate B-1505, Supplement 3, should be a Contract Carrier Permit and not a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the order which was entered January 19, 2005, remains in effect as entered but corrected in accordance with the findings contained herein.
