OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed May 18, 2000, Double J Enterprises, Inc., Lexington, Nebraska, hereinafter referred to as applicant, seeks a Permit to operate as a contract carrier of passengers by motor vehicle as follows:

AUTHORITY SOUGHT

Passengers and their baggage by bus designed to transport 16 or more passengers, including the driver, between points in Nebraska over irregular routes, under continuing contracts with IBP, Inc.

Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on May 19, 2000, pursuant to the rules of the Commission.

Since no protest was filed, Application B-1527 was processed pursuant to Rule 018.03 of the rules of procedure of the Commission.

After due consideration of the evidence and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

1. Applicant is fit, willing, and able properly to perform the service proposed and to conform to the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat., Sections 75-301 to 75-322, (Reissue 1996), and the requirements, rules and regulations of the Commission thereunder.
2. The proposed intrastate service is or will be required by the present or future public convenience and necessity to the following extent:

## PERMIT AUTHORIZED

## SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

Passengers and their baggage by bus designed to transport 16 or more passengers, including the driver, between points in Nebraska over irregular routes, under continuing contracts with IBP, Inc.

3. The application should be granted.

## O R D E R

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application B-1527 be, and it is hereby, granted; and that upon compliance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, a Permit shall be issued to Double J Enterprises, Inc., Lexington, in Application B-1527, authorizing the operations set forth in the foregoing findings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall not be issued the Permit authorized by the Commission unless and until applicant has fully complied, within a reasonable time from the effective date of this Order, with Sections 75-305 (fees), 75-307 (insurance), and 75-308 (rates), (Reissue 1996), and with the rules and regulations of the Commission; and if upon expiration of such time applicant has not complied with such terms and conditions, this Order shall, after reasonable notice to applicant, be of no further force and effect.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall not conduct operations until a Permit is issued.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall render reasonably continuous and adequate service to the public pursuant to the authority authorized.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Permit authorized shall be subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations which have been, or may hereafter be, prescribed by the Commission.
