OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed October 6, 2000, Royal Limousine, Inc., Elkhorn, Nebraska, hereinafter referred to as applicant, seeks approval of the acquisition of the operating rights and authority granted to Wegner Enterprises, Inc., dba Royal Limousine Service in Certificate B-1451, which authorizes:

SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

Passengers and their baggage by limousine between points in Dodge and Saunders Counties and between points in Dodge and Saunders Counties and between points within said counties, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points in Nebraska over irregular routes. RESTRICTION: The transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized: SUPP. 1: Transportation of passengers by luxury limousine between points in Colfax, Platte, Butler, Douglas, Cuming, Burt, Washington, and Lancaster counties over irregular routes. RESTRICTION: The transportation of railroad train crews and their baggage is not authorized. Further restricted against the transportation of passengers by vans.

In its application, applicant further requested that this Commission grant temporary approval to the applicant of a lease of the motor carrier properties and the certificate sought to be acquired by it. Notice of such request for temporary authority was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on October 10, 2000, pursuant to the rules and regulations of this Commission.

It appears that failure to grant temporary approval may result in destruction of or injury to such motor carrier property and the certificate sought to be acquired, or interfere substantially with their future usefulness in the performance of adequate and continuous service to the public.

Such temporary approval should be granted for ninety (90) days from the effective date of this Order pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. (Reissue 1996), Section 75-311.

O R D E R




IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the application for approval of a lease of the motor carrier properties and the certificate sought to be acquired by Royal Limousine, Inc., and it is hereby, granted to the applicant for ninety (90) days from the effective date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that transportation service rendered under such temporary authority shall be subject to the provisions of Neb. Rev. Stat. (Reissue 1996), Section 75-311, and to the rules, regulations and requirements of the Commission; such grant of temporary authority and the operations thereunder shall not be admissible in evidence to establish or prove present or future public convenience and necessity; and no renewal or extension of the period of ninety (90) days shall be granted.


