OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed with the Commission on June 18, 2001, R & J Limo Services, Inc., Gothenburg, Nebraska, hereinafter referred to as applicant, was issued a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity in Application B-1566.

On May 5, 2009, applicant was ordered to appear to show cause on May 20, 2009. On May 19, 2009, the Hearing Officer granted a motion to continue the May 20, 2009, hearing to a date to be determined.

As of June 2, 2009, applicant is not in full compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations; to wit: No current Form E insurance filing has been made, and no current annual fees paid. Applicant has had two suspensions, the last one entered on March 23, 2004. No effort has been made by the applicant to come into compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations.

After due consideration of the circumstances, the Commission finds that applicant should be ordered to show cause on or before June 19, 2009, why its certificate should not be revoked for its failure to comply with the Motor Carrier Rules of the Commission.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that R & J Limo Services, Inc., Gothenburg, Nebraska, be, and it is hereby ordered to show cause why its Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity should not be revoked for failure to comply with Commission rules on or before June 19, 2009, and a hearing was set for June 30, 2009, at 1:30 p.m. in the Commission Hearing Room, Lincoln.
