BY THE COMMISSION:

On March 5, 2015, and April 27, 2015, the Nebraska Public Service Commission held public hearings regarding the application of Golden Plains Transportation Services, Inc., d/b/a GPS Transportation (GPS), Lincoln, to expand its common carrier authority into Lancaster County, Nebraska.¹ During the proceeding, the Commission was made aware of customer complaints to StarTran regarding Servant Cab Company, LLC, d/b/a Yellow Cab Company and Capital Cab Company (Servant Cab), Lincoln. The complaints were not entered into evidence during the GPS proceeding; however, the complaints seemed to indicate that there are potential compliance and service issues with Servant Cab which the Commission may need to address.

Based on the above, the Commission finds that an investigation should be opened to further investigate any consumer concerns or complaints with Servant Cab's operations and services. A hearing on the matter shall be set for March 2, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. in the Commission Hearing Room, 1200 N Street, Suite 300, Lincoln, Nebraska. If the Commission finds, as a result of this investigation and the investigative hearing, that Servant Cab has violated the provision of any statute over which the Commission has jurisdiction, or any rule properly promulgated thereunder, the Commission may (a) proceed to a departmental complaint, (b) enter any order justified in the premises, or (c) upon a finding that the violation is proven by clear and convincing evidence, assess a civil penalty in an amount authorized pursuant to NEB. REV. STAT. § 75-156 (Supp. 2015).
