OPINION AND FINDINGS

On September 12, 2016, EZ Cabs, Inc. ("Applicant"), Sioux City, Iowa, filed an application seeking authority to extend its authority in Dakota, Dixon, Cedar, Thurston, Burt, Cuming, and Wayne counties by adding a designation to provide transportation for the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. A timely protest was filed by Action Taxi and Limo, Inc.

On May 23, 2017, Applicant notified the Commission it no longer intended to pursue HHS designation and wished to withdraw its application.
