BY THE COMMISSION:

On September 21, 2015, Dietrick Crittenden d/b/a Quickie Transportation ("Applicant"), Omaha, filed an application seeking authority to provide transportation of passengers by van between points in Douglas County under contract with the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services over irregular routes. The transportation of railroad train crews and their luggage is not authorized, and the HHS Designation is yes. Notice of the application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on January 26, 2016.

On March 14, 2016, orders were entered granting the Protest of Golden Plains Services, Inc., d/b/a GPS Transportation ("GPS"), and denying Protest and granting the Petition for Informal Intervention by Happy Cab Company d/b/a Checker Cab Company, Yellow Cab Company, and Happy Cab Company; Don Mark, Inc., d/b/a Cornhusker Cab Company; and Valor Transportation d/b/a Safeway Cabs ("Happy Cab").

On August 25, 2016, a telephonic planning conference was held with all parties. On August 29, 2016, a procedural schedule was adopted and the above-captioned matter was set for hearing to be held November 2, 2016.

On November 2, 2016, Applicant's attorney requested in person and by written Motion that the hearing be continued, as Applicant was unavailable due to circumstances beyond his control. Neither Protestant GPS nor Informal Intervenor Happy

Cab objected to the request. Applicant's Motion was granted on November 8, 2016.

Subsequent to the hearing date, Commission staff discussed the status of the Application with Applicant's counsel, and determined that Applicant was not making any attempt to move forward with the Application.

On December 6, 2016, the Commission entered an Order of Pending Dismissal requiring Applicant to take action on its application by December 23, 2016, or the application would be dismissed. Since the entry of the order, Commission staff have not received any communications from Applicant regarding the application.

Based on the above, the Commission finds that Application B-1918 for Dietrick Crittenden d/b/a Quickie Transportation, Omaha, should be dismissed for failure to take timely action.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. B-1918 be, and is hereby, dismissed.
