OPINION AND FINDINGS

On December 13, 2016, Omaha Medical Transport, LLC ("Applicant"), Omaha, filed an application seeking authority as a Common Carrier to provide transportation of passengers by wheelchair van in Douglas County over irregular routes and seeking HHS designation. Protest by Golden Plains Services ("GPS" or "Protestant") was granted on March 13, 2017. Informal Intervention by Happy Cab Companies ("Intervener") was also granted March 13, 2017.

On June 6, 2017, a planning conference was held to discuss a procedural schedule and set a hearing date. Ms. Ellie Rohr appeared for the Commission. Mr. Steven Ranum participated via telephone for the Applicant. Mr. Andy Pollock and Mr. Jack Shultz participated via telephone on behalf of Protestant and Intervener. As a result of that conference, a hearing was scheduled for August 29, 2017.

On August 2, 2017, Applicant submitted a formal request to withdraw the application.

After due consideration and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

- 1. The motion should be granted.
- 2. Application No. B-1946 should be dismissed.
