The Certificate authorizes the transportation of prisoners and juvenile offenders in vans and sedans in open class service between points in Nebraska over irregular routes. RESTRICATION: The transportation of clients of the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services is not authorized.

According to the Applicant, the proposed rates are based on projected income and expenses. The proposed rates are necessary to cover the cost of insurance, fuel, and vehicle maintenance.

The proposed rates are believed to be sufficient to produce a reasonable profit and still maintain a quality service.
