OPINION AND FINDINGS

On September 13, 2005, R & F Hobbies, Inc., dba Prince of the Road, Ravenna, Nebraska, filed an application for authority to amend its non-charter individual passenger service rates as follows:

Emergency action is requested.

In support of its application, the Applicant represents to the Commission that its last increase was in April of 2005. On September 1, 2005, the Department of Health and Human Services raised its per mile rate from \$1.19 to \$1.215. The applicant represents to the Commission that it will be at a disadvantage with regards to its Health and Human Services clients if the rate is not approved.

In order to grant an application on an emergency basis, the applicant must show and the Commission must find that an emergency situation exists. The Commission does find that the rates should be approved on an emergency basis due to the fact that the applicant will be at a disadvantage with regards to the Department of Health and Human Services if the rate increase is not granted. The Commission also finds that the proposed increase of less than 2% for the urban passenger rates is reasonable in light of current gasoline prices.

Upon consideration of the application and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application should be granted on an emergency basis effective September 22, 2005.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service commission that R & R Hobbies, Inc., dba Prince of the Road, Ravenna, Nebraska, be, and it is hereby, authorized to amend its non-charter individual passenger service rates as per the attached rate schedule which by reference hereto becomes a part hereof.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that public notice of this action be published in the Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, pursuant to the provisions of Section 75-121, R.R.S. 2003, and the Commission rules.
