On June 8, 1999, the Commission opened the above-captioned proceeding to conduct an investigation into the potential exhaust of assignable telephone numbers within the 402 area code. The Commission's investigation was prompted by a 1999 report by Lockheed Martin, the North American Number Plan Administrator (NANPA) at the time, which informed the Commission that the 402 area code was in danger of being depleted by 2001. Over the years, the Commission took significant steps to conserve numbering resources and extend the life of the 402 area code. Those conservation efforts helped extend the 402 area code an additional 13 years.

Consistent with the requirements of the NANPA, the Commission adopted its area code relief plan in Docket C-4152. The Commission finds that the above-captioned investigation can now be closed.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the above-captioned investigation be, and it is hereby closed.
