On January 29, 2019, GPS filed a request for stay of Commission enforcement of the recent rule amendments approved in Rule and Regulation No. 199, effective January 16, 2019, against GPS during the pendency of the declaratory ruling petition. In its request, GPS states that it would like to continue providing on-demand services as it had done prior to the recent rules becoming effective.

Having been duly advised on the premises, the Commission finds that GPS' request for stay of enforcement of the rule amendments approved in Rule and Regulation 199, effective January 16, 2019, pending a decision of the Commission related to the above-captioned docket is denied.

ORDER

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the January 29, 2019 request for stay of enforcement action filed by Golden Plains Services, Inc. d/b/a GPS Transportation be, and is hereby, denied.
