On April 30, 2001, DJW, Inc., dba Luxury Limousine Service, Syracuse, Nebraska, filed an application for authority to establish limousine rates for its use as follows:

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Applicant is a certificated common carrier which holds Certificate B-1554. The certificate authorizes the transportation of passengers by limousine and luxury or stretch limousine between points in Otoe county and between points within said county on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points in Nebraska over irregular routes. The authority is restricted against the transportation of railroad train crews and clients of Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services.

According to the Applicant, the proposed rates are based on expenses and are competitive with other limousine services operating similar type equipment. The proposed rates are necessary to cover the cost of insurance, fuel, and vehicle maintenance. The proposed rates are believed to be sufficient to produce a reasonable profit and still maintain a quality service.

Applicant recently received its authority to provide a limousine service in Otoe county. It currently does not have limousine rates on file. The proposed rates are competitive with other carriers providing a similar service with like equipment. The application is filed in compliance with Section 75-308 (Rates) and 75-121 (Emergency rate orders), R.R.S. 1996 and the Commission rules.

Upon consideration of the application and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application should be granted on an emergency basis effective May 11, 2001.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that effective May 11, 2001, DJW, Inc., dba Luxury Limousine Service, Syracuse, Nebraska, be, and it is hereby, authorized to establish limousine rates for its use as follows:
