OPINION AND FINDINGS

On September 19, 2005, Omaha Ambulance Service, Omaha, Nebraska filed an application for authority to amend its transportation rates as follows:

Notice of the application was published in $\frac{\text{The Daily Record}}{\text{Nebraska}}$, Omaha, Nebraska on September 27, 2005, pursuant to the Commission rules. There were no protests filed.

The Applicant is a certificated common carrier which holds Certificate B-1250. The certificate authorizes the transportation of handicapped or incapacitated passengers and their baggage between points in Nebraska over irregular routes. APPLICATION NO. LR-260

According to the Applicant, a rate increase is necessary primarily due to the increased costs of fuel. The Applicant has also experienced increased costs in its insurance programs, employee compensation and other costs associated with operating a business.

After consultation with Commission staff, one adjustment was made to the proposed rate structure. The rates as applied for called requested a sixty percent increase in the mileage rate for miles 15 through 74. The rate adjustment reduces this amount from \$2.00 per mile to \$1.50 per mile, a twenty percent increase rather than the sixty percent proposed.

Applicant's current rates were last authorized in 2003. The proposed rates range from 7 percent to 20 percent. With the costs of gasoline, even at the current levels, having risen well over fifty percent since 2003, and the consumer price index rising somewhat over five percent during that time, the proposed rates do appear to be appropriate. Applicant's proposed rates are competitive with the rates on file for other carriers providing similar services in the Omaha metropolitan area.

Upon consideration of the application and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application should be granted.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Omaha Ambulance Service, Inc., Omaha, Nebraska, be, and it is hereby, authorized to amend its transportation rates as follows:
