OPINION AND FINDINGS

By application filed on June 9, 1992, Shipper's Transportation, Inc., Grand Island, Nebraska, hereinafter referred to as applicant, seeks to extend the present authority in Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity issued in Application M-12964, Supplement 1 as follows:

AUTHORITY SOUGHT

SUPPLEMENT NO. 1

Household goods and office equipment between points in Nebraska over irregular routes.

Notice of the above-captioned application was published in The Daily Record, Omaha, Nebraska, on June 10, 1992, pursuant to the rules of the Commission.

Timely protests to the granting of this application were filed on June 19, 1992, by Bekins Van & Storage Co. and on June 30, 1992, by Star Warehousing. The protests were subsequently withdrawn on August 6, 1992, by Star Warehousing and on September 9, 1992, by Bekins Van & Storage Co. Application M-12964, Supplement No. 2 was then processed pursuant to Rule 018.03 of the rules of the Commission.

After due consideration of the evidence and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds:

1. Applicant is fit, willing, and able properly to perform the extended service and to conform to the provisions of Sections 75-301 to 75-322.04, R.R.S. 1943, as amended, and the requirements, rules and regulations of the Commission thereunder.
2. The proposed extension of applicant's present intrastate service is or will be required by the present or future public convenience and necessity to the following extent:

CERTIFICATE AUTHORIZED

SERVICE AND TERRITORY AUTHORIZED:

Household goods and office equipment between points in Nebraska over irregular routes.

3. The application for extension should be granted.

O R D E R

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that Application No. M-12964, Supplement 2 be, and it is hereby, granted; and that upon compliance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Order, a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity shall be issued to Shipper's Transportation, Inc., Grand Island, Nebraska, in Application M-12964, Supplement 2 authorizing the operations set forth in Paragraph No. 2 of the foregoing findings.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall not be issued the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity authorized by the Commission unless and until applicant has fully complied, within a reasonable time from the effective date of this Order, with Sections 75-305 (fees), 75-307 (insurance), and 75-308 (rates), R.R.S. 1943, as amended, and with the rules and regulations of the Commission; and if upon expiration of such time applicant has not complied with such terms and conditions, this order shall, after reasonable notice to applicant, be of no further force and effect.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall not conduct the operations until a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity is issued.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that applicant shall render reasonably continuous and adequate service to the public pursuant to the authority authorized.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity authorized shall be subject to the terms, conditions, and limitations which have been, or may hereafter be, prescribed by the Commission.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the hearing set for September 23, 1992, shall be, and it is hereby, cancelled.
