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COMES NOW Robert R. Logsdon, complainant in the above-captioned cause, pursuant to <u>Neb. Rev. Stat.</u> Section 75-322.02 (1990 Reissue), and for complaint against Brad Olson, dba Pro Movers, defendant, alleges as follows:

- 1. Complainant is the Director of the Transportation Department of the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) and is the custodian of the Commission's Motor Transportation Department documents and records.
- 2. Defendant, Brad Olson, dba Pro Movers, operates as a motor carrier conducting for-hire intrastate carriage of household goods in the State of Nebraska. Examination of the Transportation Department's records and documents reveals that defendant does not have authority, either by certificate or permit, to conduct for-hire intrastate carriage, nor is defendant leased to any regulated intrastate motor carrier with the requisite authority.
- 3. On or about October 12, 1993, NPSC Inspector Steve Finke contacted defendant, Brad Olson, and explained to the defendant that he needed intrastate authority from the Commission to perform for-hire intrastate shipments of household goods in Nebraska. At that time defendant agreed to perform only locally-exempt moves within the city of North Platte until such time as he could obtain a certificate of authority from the Commission.
- 4. The defendant willfully violated the Nebraska statutes and the rules and regulations of the Commission by shipping household goods in Nebraska intrastate commerce for compensation without a certificate or permit of authority, to wit:
 - A. On or about December 10, 1993, defendant transported household goods without authority from North Platte, Nebraska, to Lincoln, Nebraska, and billed the client approximately \$1,140.00 for said movement.
 - B. On or about December 23, 1993, the defendant transported household goods without authority from Wellfleet, Nebraska, to North Platte, Nebraska, and billed the client approximately \$320.00 for said movement.

- 5. Defendant's shipments of regulated commodities on the dates alleged above were in violation of Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 75-309, as amended, for operating as a common carrier without a certificate of authority issued by the Commission.
- 6. Defendant also violated Neb. Rev. Stat. Sections 75-124, 75-308, and 75-126(1)(e) for nonconformance in charging the applicable tariff rate established for intrastate household goods movements; and defendant violated Section 75-307 of the statutes for failing to file proof of liability insurance with the Commission.

WHEREFORE, complainant prays the Commission for an order levying a civil penalty against the defendant pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. Section 75-322.02, as amended, and Title 291, Chapter 1, Rule 027.02 of the Commission's rules in an amount not less than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and any other order the Commission deems appropriate and which is within its jurisdiction to render, including, but not limited to, an order that the defendant cease and desist from further operating without authority in Nebraska intrastate commerce.
