BY THE COMMISSION:

On the motion filed by the complainant in this matter on March 14, 2000, the Commission finds as follows:

Complainant, Robert Logsdon, presented preliminary evidence that respondents listed in Exhibit A have failed to comply with the Commission rules and regulations concerning payment of fees. Specifically, complainant allges:

Opinion and Findings

- 1. Complainant is the Director of the Department of Motor Transportation of this Commission.
- 2. Respondents, listed in Exhibit A, are motor carriers certificated by the Public Service Commission to operate in the state of Nebraska.
- 3. The requirements the respondents must meet in order to be in full compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations include the obligation of respondents to pay annual fees, under Neb. Rev. Stat., Section 75-305 (Reissue 1996) and Title 291, Chapter 3, Rule 004 et. seq. of the Nebraska Public Service Commission Motor Carrier Rules and Regulations. The annual fees become delinquent on March 1.
- 4. As of March 14, 2000, respondents still have not paid their annual fees as required, therefore are not in compliance with the Commission's rules and regulations.

Accordingly, the Commission finds that the respondents should be ordered to show cause why the Commission should not (1) revoke respondents' Certificates of Public Convenience and Necessity, (2) order respondents to cease and desist from offering services as motor carriers in Nebraska pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat., Section 75-133 (Reissue 1996), and (3) order that the respondents remit any such fines authorized by law.
