OPINION AND FINDINGS

On August 21, 1995, the Commission entered an order in this matter in which it ordered the following named carriers to show cause why their certificates of public convenience and necessity authorizing transportation of general commodities should not be revoked in their entirety for willful failure to perform transportation of household goods pursuant to Neb. Rev. Stat. 75-311, as amended by LB 424:

The only carrier that appeared was Inter Cities Courier Systems, Inc. of Omaha. It produced copies of freight bills that showed that it has recently performed transportation of household goods in Nebraska intrastate commerce consistent with the authority it held prior to the passage of LB 424.

From the evidence adduced and being fully informed in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that:

 The certificates of public convenience and necessity held by the carriers cited in the Commission's order herein on August 21, 1995, should be revoked and cancelled except for the certificate held by Inter Cities Courier Systems, Inc. in M-13498. APPLICATION NO. PI-10

Inter Cities Courier Systems, Inc. should be granted authority as follows:

Transportation of household goods by straight trucks or small vehicles between Omaha and points within a 100-mile radius of Omaha over irregular routes.

The rest of the authority held by Inter Cities should be revoked pursuant to LB 424.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the certificates of public convenience and necessity held by those carriers mentioned in the foregoing findings who failed to show cause why their authority to transport household goods under their authority to transport general commodities should not be revoked be, and they are hereby, revoked, and a copy of this order shall be included in the file of each of those carriers.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be, and it is hereby, granted to Inter Cities Courier Systems, Inc. as set forth in the foregoing findings.
