BY THE COMMISSION:

The purpose of an order nunc pro tunc is to correct the record which has been made so that it will truly record the action taken which, through inadvertence or mistake, was not truly recorded. Clerical errors may be corrected by an order nunc pro tunc, but not judicial errors.

On August 28, 2012, the Nebraska Public Service Commission (Commission) entered an order granting the application of B.J.Z., Inc., d/b/a Checker Cab Company (Checker Cab), Norfolk, to amend its taxi rates on file with the Commission under docket TR-192. The application was granted on an emergency basis.

Due to a clerical error, the order incorrectly stated on page three, "Line I" of the Rate Description, "Within the City of Norfolk." The order should have stated in Line I, "Within the City of Norfolk and Columbus."

Based on the above, the Commission finds that the August 28, 2012 order should be corrected as set forth herein. The remainder of the August 28, 2012, order remains unchanged and in full effect.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that the August 28, 2012, order should be corrected as set forth herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the remainder of the August 28, 2012, order remains unchanged and in full effect as entered.
