OPINION AND FINDINGS

On August 24, 2012, B.J.Z., Inc., dba Checker Cab Company, Norfolk, Nebraska filed an application for authority to amend its taxi rates for its use as follows:

Emergency action is requested.

Applicant is a certificated common carrier which holds Certificate B-1433. The certificate authorizes the transportation of passengers and their baggage by taxicab, in the City of Norfolk and vicinity. Supplement 1 to its APPLICATION NO. TR-192

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certificate authorizes the transportation of passengers and their baggage by taxi between points in Madison, Stanton, Wayne, Pierce, Antelope and Boone counties and between points in said counties, on the one hand, and, on the other hand, points within a 150 mile radius of Norfolk, Nebraska over irregular routes.

The proposed rate represents a decrease in the mileage rate from thirty cents per seventh mile to twenty-one cents per seventh mile, and a decrease in the out-of-town mileage rate from \$2.10 per mile to \$1.45 per mile. The out-of-town round trip rate would be deleted. All other rates are proposed to remain the same.

According to the Applicant, the proposed rates are necessary due to its contractual relationship with the State of Nebraska Department of Social Services (NDHHS). The Applicant is desirous of increasing its opportunities with NDHHS. On August 1, 2012, NDHHS, through its contractor AMR, changed the methodology to determine how trips are allocated and which entity performs the given trips. The proposed rate is designed to maximize the potential business with NDHHS.

Applicant's current rates were authorized in July of 2011. The proposed rates are competitive with rates of other companies providing similar services and are competitive.

In order to grant the application on an emergency basis, the Commission must find that an emergency situation exists. In this situation, the Applicant has stated that the number of trips that they have received form NDHHS has dropped since a change in the methodology used by NDHHS was made on August 1, 2012. The Applicant has requested that eh reduction in rates proposed be granted as soon as possible so that it can have the rates available for its use with NDHHS. The Commission finds that the Applicant should be placed in a position to use these rates immediately. The Commission finds that the rates should become effective on August 29, 2012.

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Upon consideration of the application and being fully advised in the premises, the Commission is of the opinion and finds that the application should be granted on an emergency basis effective August 29, 2012.

ORDER

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED by the Nebraska Public Service Commission that effective August 29, 2012, B.J.Z., Inc., dba Checker Cab Company, Norfolk, Nebraska be, and it is hereby, authorized to amend its taxi rates as follows:
